The WIIT Charitable Trust scholarship program is designed to provide financial assistance to further educational objectives of women who are interested in international development, international relations, international trade, international economics, or international business.

About the Scholarship

- ❖ **Amount:** 2 scholarships of \$1500 each (one for an undergraduate female student and one for a graduate female student) for the Summer or Fall 2011 Semester and the Spring 2012 Semester. Each recipient will also receive a free one year membership in WIIT.
- ❖ **Eligibility Requirements:** Applicants must meet the following criteria. No exceptions will be considered.
 - ❖ Be **currently** enrolled or accepted at an accredited U.S. university or college, either full-time or part-time (**Undergraduate and graduate students** are eligible);
 - ❖ Demonstrated interest in international development, international relations, international trade, international economics, or international business;
 - ❖ And be a **woman**.
 - ❖ Note: Applications from relatives of the directors and officers of the Association of Women in International Trade, Inc. and members of the WIIT Charitable Trust Committee and the Selection Committee are not eligible for consideration.
- ❖ **Selection Criteria:** Awards will be based on quality of the assigned essay. Furthermore, the selection committee will pay close attention to the candidate's interest in international trade issues. Awards are made without regard to race, creed, color, or religion. WIIT reserves the right to revise, suspend, or discontinue this program without notice. Essays may be published in the WIIT Newsletter if they are of publishable quality as determined in the sole discretion of WIIT.
- ❖ **Entry Period:** Completed applications, essays and transcripts, or letter of admission (proof of acceptance to a college or university) must be received no later than **April 15, 2011** if applying for assistance for the Summer or Fall 2011 semesters and **June 15, 2011** if applying for assistance for the Spring 2012 semester.
- ❖ **Notification:** Winners will be notified by June 15, 2011 for Fall 2011 applicants and September 15, 2011 for Spring 2012 applicants.

Submission of an essay will be construed as the applicant granting WIIT permission to use, reproduce, edit, prepare derivative works of, modify, publish or otherwise make use of essays submitted in any and all media for any purpose.
4. WIIT reserves the right to reject any essay without assigning any reason therefor. Any decision taken to this effect shall be final and binding and not subject to any dispute or challenge.

Applicant agrees to hold WIIT, its officers, directors, agents, successors and assigns harmless from and against any claims of any nature arising in connection with WIIT's use of applicant's essays in any manner in WIIT's sole and absolute discretion. Applicant further waives the right to claim any damages whatsoever including, but not limited to, punitive, consequential, direct or indirect damages. Except where prohibited, applicant agrees that any and all disputes, claims and causes of action arising out of or connected with this scholarship program shall be resolved under the laws of the District of Columbia without regard to any conflict of laws issue.

- ❖ A **completed application** includes a 3-5 page essay, applicant information, and proof of acceptance or current enrollment in an accredited U.S. college or university. All materials should be submitted by email only to info@wiittrust.org (no hard copies).

- ❖ Only one submission entry will be accepted from each entrant.
- ❖ The decisions of the WIIT Trust's Selection Committee are final. The WIIT Trust reserves the right to disqualify any essay submission that does not conform to the above stipulated guidelines.

2011 / 2012 Essay Topic

“Big Business vs. Small Business: How Can Each Help Meet the Goal of Doubling U.S. Exports by 2013?”

The essay needs to demonstrate research by applicant of relevant trade data and resources to develop the theme in an academic manner. The challenges that may face each entity and examples of how the question can be answered should be covered. The typed essay should be between **3-5 pages** in length, double-spaced, 12 pt. Times New Roman font, with all pages clearly numbered, and submitted in a PDF format. A detailed bibliography should be included. The essay must be written in English and must conform to the guidelines of the Chicago Manual of Style (http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools_citationguide.html)
